
## Make it!

## wild animals

You could use this idea in a Starters or Movers class.



## **Need** white or coloured sheets of paper, colouring pencils or paints, glue and scissors

Instructions for making the giraffes

- Learners use scissors and glue to make long cones out of yellow coloured paper. Alternatively use paint or pencils to colour white paper yellow.
- Stick or paint brown spots and squares onto the yellow cone necks.
- Draw and cut out a yellow giraffe's head adding a tab about 5cms long. Glue the tab into the inside of the cone (or use a paper clip).
- Make a tree canopy (with side flaps so it stands up). Stand the giraffes behind the tree canopy.

## For the dinosaurs

- Draw wiggly lines on a sheet of green or grey paper. If you don't have this colour, paint or colour white paper green or grey.
- Use scissors and glue to make a cone neck out of the paper.
- Draw a dinosaur's head with its tab as for the giraffes. Cut it out and stick it (or use a paper clip) to fix it into the top of each cone neck.
- Make a row of bushes (with side flaps so it stands up). Stand the dinosaurs behind the bushes.

Ask questions about the giraffes and dinosaurs, for example:

How many giraffes/dinosaurs have we got?

What colour are they?

What are they doing?

How many legs has a giraffe got?

What don't giraffes/dinosaurs like eating?

What can't giraffes/dinosaurs do?
